

Decision of the Board of the Georgian Anti-Doping Agency (GADA) 28.04.2020

1. To adopt the anti-doping rules of the Georgian Anti-Doping Agency 2021.
2. Ensure that the rules enter into force officially by October 1, 2020.
3. To ensure that The Anti-Doping Disciplinary and Appeal Boards of the Georgian Anti-Doping Agency to be established as the separate legal entities.
4. To establish a Therapeutic Use Exemption Commission for a period of 4 years, consisting of 3 members.
- 5 To request the Ministry of Science, Education, Culture and Sports of Georgia, together with the GADA , to develop the Mechanism for Enforcement of Violation Sanctions of the anti-doping rules.
6. To request the Ministry of Science, Education, Culture and Sports of Georgia to develop a mechanism for financing anti-doping disciplinary and appellate councils together with the GADA and to request the Ministry to consider their financing in the 2021 budget of the GADA

1. To ensure that anti-doping rules are formally approved by the end of 2021.
2. To submit the Anti-Doping Rules of the Georgian Anti-Doping Agency 2021, to all National Federations, that have signed a cooperation agreement with GADA.
3. To apply to the national federations with a request to renew the cooperation agreement with GADA with the inclusion of the Anti-Doping Rules of the Georgian Anti-Doping Agency 2021.
